Service Coordination & Wraparound Services

Enhance Service Coordination & Wraparound Services

a) Increase linkages (partners) to CFFC to build connections, opportunities for communication and provide cross-system training (Leadership Cohort). b) Structure CFFC meetings to identify and understand the needs of children/families and gaps in service and identify partnership opportunities to address the needs/gaps. c) CFFC, Ohio Rise, InCK and other local Wraparound/Service Coordination (SC) providers align to coordinate services, including revision of SC mechanism. d) Reduce any wait list for Wraparound/SC. e) Increase number of youth served through Wraparound/SC. f) CANS completion compliance of youth involved in CST- within 30 days of case opening and every 90 days while case is open. g) % of youth in residential placement at time of referral, or who go into residential placement while involved in CST, Ohio Rise, InCK who step down to a lower (least restrictive) level of care by case closure. h) % Youth involved in CST, Ohio Rise, InCK family teaming who are diverted from placement. i) 50-100% of family plan goals met at time of case closure for youth involved in CST. Ohio Rise. InCK.

Collaborative, community-based early interventions

Increase availability, utilization of Early Childhood Mental Health services & supports to reduce deeper involvement in child welfare, behavioral health, juvenile justice systems.

ECCC case consultation, identify gaps in services/capacity to provide ECMH/opportunities to implement service enhancements. Promote/refer to community-based services: CST, LCBDD EI, Triple P, HMG Home Visiting, Head Start/Early Head Start, public pre-schools, Mental Health First Aid training, BBBS, MHA Boys and Girls Club, YES Club, Preschool Expulsion Prevention Programs, Ohio Rise, InCK, etc.

Trauma Informed Care (TIC)

Creating Trauma Informed Environments

a) % of responding Orgs incorporating TIC values into their practice and guide to improve services using a TI model, the 6 TI principles, etc. b) % of responding Orgs complete environmental assessment and plan to create TI environment for staff and those served. c) # organizations signing cooperative agreement to embrace TI practices. d) Produce 4 SOS newsletters to support community providers.
